Only one book can be used for each entry. No repeats. Check off each box as you complete a book and write the name of the book and author. This not a race against other readers, only against yourself. Officially the challenge began on September 1st, but it can begin on any day you like. The day you register is when it begins and nothing you've read before counts!

25 readers have already signed up for the challenge!

#### SPICE CLUB

In years past Virginia Barden and Marie McCutcheon tackled all the local Ripley cemeteries and their work is kept at the Ripley Library in the historical section. They mapped out burial sites in East Ripley and South Ripley cemeteries, as well as others. The work Bird did would be a wonderful addition to that initial task.

If you'd like to read the article, titled "Ripley Hears Update on Cemetery Work" the newspaper will be available at the library for a limited time.

## Free Food Give-Away from Cornell Cooperative Extension

Please remember, every Saturday through the middle of October, a free box of food is available at the Ripley Public Library. This is not the same as the Food Express which is available on a monthly basis. This is a separate program and is available due to our community being in a "Food Desert". These programs are a wonderful thing and is a boon not only to our community, but also the local farmers who participate with these programs.



The farmers receive revenue from the State for their products, Cornell Cooperative Ext. organizes the delivery and we get to benefit from this. Procedures such as this help keep our economy and our bodies strong. The more you participate, the more people will benefit. This is not a charity, this is fulfilling a need in our community. Let's keep the cycle moving.



Molly Harvey, a SNAP-ED Nutritionist from the Cornell Co-op Extension, visits the Ripley library twice a month to share recipes that are not only yummy, but healthy and inexpensive. Taste testing is always a component of



her visits, and oftentimes she brings little goodies such as insulated grocery bags, measuring spoons, or refrigerator temperature indicators. If you've never been, give it a try. Each session is different and always a rollicking good time!





What is a Safe Place Location, you might ask. A Safe Place works with the Safe House out of Jamestown and is part of Chautauqua Opportunities, Inc. This is a program for runaway or homeless youth under the age of 18. If this youth needs help, all they do is enter the facility displaying the yellow sign that reads SAFE PLACE. They let someone in charge know they need help.















